- 5) Superintendent's Report plus guests Director Deanna Holitzki & District Principal Naomi Ross
  - Lots of good things are happening. Indigenous focused Professional Development Day.
     Wonderful day of learning for all.
  - Approved a draft strategic plan for field testing. Screen share for how to access feedback on the
    draft. Highlighted a few pages of note. Demographics, Mission/Vision/Value Statement positions the board. Strategic priorities Lifelong Learners, Connected Learners, Caring &
    Inclusive Learning Culture, Cultural & Identity Development and Career Development. Based on
    2800 points of feedback in the community sessions, staff sessions and online.
  - Preliminary draft budget present relatively optimistic keeping student numbers steady. School food programs will be a new development for next year.
  - Director Deanna Holitzki & District Principal Naomi Ross Childcare and Kindergarten transitions.

- District Principal Naomi Ross one early learning goal is to have staff involved in programs to improve student connectedness to school and the other goal is to strengthen community partnerships to support a positive kindergarten transition.

   Important role of families, play, relationships, community.
- Provincial Programs StrongStart, Changing Possibilities for Young Children,

  year is the Childhood Experiences Questionnaire (CHEQ) developed by UBC and collects
  information on experiences that are strongly linked to children's health and well-being,
  education and social outcomes
- Child Care Update there are 11 childcare and early years programs on SD8 property.
   Currently doing an Environmental Scan of child care to help inform the district and ministry. Only one is a SD8 program at Winlaw, the others are private or independent contractors.

- Operation & Finance
  - Historical budgets developed in the spring have been conservative with enrollment estimates lower than actuals of kids in school on September 30.
  - DPAC rep for Op & Finance committee indicated the April 6 meeting started late due to technical issues, and included highlights about geographic challenges. No discussion about whether the funding is sufficient.
  - DPAC could consider drafting a letter to have more time to review the sessions.
  - Want to highlight kudos for the budget to staff/board since it is balanced.
  - The Special Purpose Funds slide was shared from the Prelim Budget Presentation
  - April 25 is a public forum on the preliminary budget
  - Next Operations & Finance meeting is in May.
  - Representative thinks there should be more metrics to assess progress.

- LVR Atlas program, Principal's update, grad, student led yearbook, staffing changes
- ARES field trips, learning share, Willie Wonka play
- Redfish basketball tournament at Hume with six different schools, garden planting in progress, year end festivities, fundraising has been a little less with burnout, discussion about next year, staffing changes, wondering how principal turnover at SD8 compares to other districts, but Redfish has had higher turnover than others over the years so are looking for a stable administration but this could depend on the demographics of the group.
- Blewett spring activities are in full swing, dance fusion for a full-school course, new startup from Principal for a movie night, talent show, school wide BBQ, starting up Halloween committee early in August to plan haunted house event
- MSSS new cell phone policy one of the last schools in the district to do this, academy class is going to Vancouver for a week for the first time in a few years.
- DESK PAC meeting on Monday.
- Hume movie night and bake sale, ice cream social event, bike rodeo.

- CBESS field trip for 5-7 class, grocery gift cards looking for volunteers, will be discussing staffing
  concerns at the next PAC meeting, garden is starting up, student led conferences, after school
  programs starting up, silent auction for the student exchange program went well, movie nights
  for exchange fundraising as well.
- Creston Wildflower getting ready for year end camping trip to Kokanee Creek, kids enjoying Roots of Empathy program, had second ever student entrepreneurial market at the Creston Rec Centre filled the whole room and the students did amazing and a great community response.
- Nelson Wildflower proud to have completed outdoor playground setup and are planning a grand opening, raffle for a new library space, concern about the field trip forms and that field trips have decreased because of this.
