9) Discussion Items

a) BCCPAC Membership for DPAC and PACs

- It is time to renew BCCPAC memberships
- Natalia motions that DPAC pays the DPAC BCCPAC membership of \$150 for 2023/2024 school year from our gaming account as soon as possible. All in favour, Seconded by Chris
- PACs can now pay for BCCPAC memberships with their gaming accounts but in the past DPAC has
 paid. Natalia thinks having the PACs register and then get reimbursed is not necessarily any
 easier/quicker than doing it herself.
- Out of 23 schools there were 6 PACs in SD8 not registered.
- Discussion generally that the DPAC should pay and give more support to the PACs next year about the value of BCCPAC.
- Natalia motions that the DPAC pays for BCCPAC memberships for district school PAC for the 2023/2024 school year. Colleen seconds. (If a school wants to register themselves they can still send a receipt for reimbursement.) All in favour, none opposed
- Natalia motions to change the mileage subsidy from \$0.45/km to \$0.61/km to reflect today's gas prices. Vanessa and Colleen seconded, all in favour
- Taryn will make the expense report form electronically to put on the website
- The old form had a limit of \$80/trip and says it is only for authorized DPAC travel. Can be used for advocates. It is for a minimum trip of 40km. Recommend it is a \$99 limit and anything over would be assessed on a case-by-case basis.
- Current C&B says that any expense over \$100 needs DPAC approval.
- Budget of \$500 for this year spending for advocacy travel for this year. Seconded by Chris. All in favour
- Motion to change form to take out a minimum trip vote now for the skeleton of the form and vote in September. Chris motions to make changes to the DPAC claim form and the new form will be voted on in September. Seconded by Lisa. AIF. Discussion.
- Authorized DPAC travel, no greater than \$99/trip. Add to the form that the mileage is as determined by google maps.

b) Feeding Futures

- There are meetings for each family of schools. Creston is June 22 at 11AM. Slocan Valley is June 22 12:30. Crawford Bay is June 21 at 11AM.
- The Superintendent will ask Director Holitzki to send it to the DPACs.

- Hope next year DPAC will be invited to attend all of the school family presentations.

- Governance and Policy attended by Natalia one policy was presented and sent to the board for approval. Some other policies going out for field testing in the fall.

 - Viewed the Enhancing Student Learning Report (discussed above with link)
 - Principal for Canyon-Lister shared their school plan and street level data. Showed that
 they use the framework from the district (strategic plan) and then use the framework for
 their school plan to ensure that it aligns with the district strategic plan.

11) School Reports

- LVR grad and cavalcade, graffiti, schedules, grade 9 orientation sessions at the end of May, finishing off gaming grant spending, make sure gaming grant application is in for next year!!
- Blewett AGM on Tuesday, positions are firm for September, will be making a new position for communications and advertising, bought a new popcorn machine from fundraising efforts, planning to kick of first week of September with halloween committee
- ARES kindergarten class has an incubator so watching baby chicks hatch, recognized parent
 volunteers, don't have many parents at meetings but have a huge amount of volunteers for
 events, kindergarten grad and tea, reconciliation walk/run next week, staff appreciation lunch
 hosted by Grade 7s, end of school celebration
- BK last meeting talked about successes and looking forward, bingo night, fundraising focus this
 year was school tshirts, maybe jerseys next year, perhaps a seasonal craft/fall fair next year, rail
 trail art collaboration, Natalia talked about Feeding Futures and Advocacy
- MSSS Passport to the Kootenays book is the major fundraiser to fund the bursaries that the PAC awards, FoundryBC gave a presentation, saying goodbye to VP, PAC celebration next week, end of the year Silverwood trip
- Nelson Wildflower school did a flash mob on Baker today, had wanted Victoria McAllister to stay as Principal,
- DESK no meeting
- Erickson fun and games for June, Grade 7s to Silverwood, new principal, looking forward to building community
- HL Creston apprehension about next principal, no fundraising this year, cohorts are figuring out
 what they will look like, had a traveling forge that was well attended, unofficial trip to Silverwood
 with 250 people attending
- CB has gained Victoria, excited about new principal, losing quite a few teachers but interviews have started, lost a chef for hot lunch, considering a newsletter for the school next year in case the internet quality is hampering communication, PAC is undergoing a huge change with 4 members moving on, many new families at the school, not great turnout with the meeting with the new principal, Grade 4-7 class has been building games to be played at a family day at the end of June, Grad had some fundraisers, 5 graduates, garden is producing well

All executive positions do become available at the AGM and need new committee reps and executives!!
