- 5) Superintendent's Report plus guests Tamara Maloff and Ben Eaton, Numeracy, regrets from Superintendent, Deanna Director Holitzki in her place
  - Spring break starting, great time for renewal and getting outside
  - Student symposium was on February 22, same day as Pink Shirt Day,
  - April activities run and training for the run
    - District Principal Tamara Maloff and Director of InstructionBen Eaton Numeracy Report
    - Goal is to improve numeracy proficiency for ALL learners
    - Key action plan is to being development of a 3 year district numeracy plan
    - Key supports for schools a District Numeracy Teacher Coordinator, workshops for staff, resources like kits and books, transition meetings between schools, school plans

- Primary plans expand in scope and depth as students progress in the grades
- Middle years practice reasoning mathematically use multiple strategies to solve problems, SD8 will be introducing an assessment process as there is a provincial assessment in Grade 7 and then not until Grade 10
- Graduation program the Graduation Numeracy Assessment (GNA) is written in grade
   10 and heavily relies on literacy and comprehension, and can be written up to 3 times. It is a graduation requirement for the province.
- Schools can get detailed information on areas of numeracy to develop school plans.

## 7) Correspondence

- Advocacy resolution for BCCPAC AGM see below. Vancouver DPAC members have been invited to our advocacy training Level 1 as it is a unique program in DPACs.
- Saanich is sending a letter of support in regard to the dyslexia resolutions for the BCCPAC AGM.
- Parent education opportunity request how to read to kids and do it properly. CBAL does offer literacy programs so they may be able to help us out.
- Email from Wildsight programs that it does not have Columbia Basin Trust funding any more. Can call into CBT zoom meetings coming up for strategic planning.
- Some parents are asking for the DPAC to write a letter of support to the district saying that we need more Educational Assistants in the district. It does not mean there would be more EAs but that the DPAC. Looking for a parent volunteer to propose a letter but then it would need to be agreed on by the PACs before sending.

- 8) Discussion Items
- a) District communication protocol
  - Is usually covered in advocacy training.
  - Is a flowchart for resolving complaints or concerns depending on where the complaint or concern is.
  - Generally matters will be taken care of and resolved well before it needs to get to the board.
  - Emphasis on relying on advocates to help parents out navigating the process.
- b) Dyslexia resolutions for BCCPAC AGM and support letter from Vancouver DPAC- see agenda
  - There are some wording changes but the intention of the resolution is still the same so no vote is needed.
  - Has not yet been added to the online AGM booklet.
- c) Support letters for North Vancouver and for Vancouver on resolutions do we want to reciprocate and write support letters?
- d) BCCPAC AGM Motion to pay for 2 DPAC executives to attend May 5-7 on our DPAC's behalf from gaming account and chequing account by Natalia, up to \$2500 to cover accommodation, travel and registration.
  - Some gaming money can be used for the BCCPAC AGM but not all gaming money can be used.
  - AGM is open to DPAC executives first and then to DPAC reps. One person from our district will need to speak to our motions.
  - Motioned by Natalia, seconded by Jessie, All in Favour, Motion has Passed
  - Natalia will reach out to the DPAC Execs and then the DPAC Reps. There is a discount to take a new person.
- e) Advocacy training level 1 April 17th at 6:30 pm motion by Natalia to allocate \$100 more if needed. Misspoke last motion for funding and it is actually up to \$500 (Castlegar might share the session and payment with us). Motion has passed.

- LVR school fees, gaming grant spring intake, grad/yearbook, Atlas program, vaping in bathroom

- O&F meeting meeting March 14, next O&F meeting is in April
- KLTF highlighted that there are more students than budgeted, SD tries not to overestimate
  numbers and has for the last few years underestimated students. It is a continuous
  improvement process and will be looking at this.
