5) Superintendent's Report - Guest Deanna Holitzki - Food Equity

- Return to school great to have everyone learning again
- Note Ministry reporting policy is in place, also have new performance standards to support the reporting policy.
- Parent Engagement Night on Ministry reporting last week will have 2 sessions a month. Are virtual and details are on the school district calendar.
- National Day of Truth and Reconciliation is on a Saturday so will be observed in the school on Monday.
 - Feeding Futures Funding new funding in place as of April 1.

- Presentation by Deanna Holitzki, Director of Instruction
- SD8 has received approximately \$644k this year from the Ministry for this program to expand or create local food programs in school primarily for vulnerable students
- \circ $\,$ School food programs may continue to include breakfast, lunch and snack programs.
- Districts must follow the guiding documents which include the Canada Food Guide, and Guidelines for Food and Beverage Sales in BC Schools (includes any food that is provided or prepared).
- Must have Food Safe Certification (at least the operator and one other person on site).
- The School Meal and School Nutrition Program Handbook was created to support programs.
- Where possible use BC grown foods to help support local farmers, the local economy and optimize the freshness of food.
- Other partnerships include the BC Fruit and Vegetable Nutrition Program (this is a universal program for ALL students)
- Also part of a pilot project for some of the rural schools to get more fruits & vegetables in schools.
- Interior Health has also assigned a nutritionist to work with each school district.
- PACs can help by continuing to volunteer and support programs at the school and continue to advocate for universal food program funding through the DPAC and BCCPAC.
- PAC groups can continue with food fundraisers caveat means they must follow the guidelines. Food should be in the "choose most" category and cannot have a mark-up exceeding 20%.
- PAC groups need to complete an application form prior to starting food service, ensure the kitchen operator and one other person have FoodSafe and that the record checks are completed.
- SD8 has hired a Feeding Futures/School Food Advisor and has scanned schools regarding the programs and spaces.
- Questions how do we get rolling and where do we find the information? The Advisor is getting into contact with schools through the Principals. Links were on the presentation which will be sent to Natalia. Although they are called GUIDELINES they are being treated as REQUIRED. Concern with rural schools and the new guidelines being restrictive will be able to use support staff for some of the shopping and the BC Agriculture program is significantly expanded for the pilot project schools.
- Guidelines are being updated this fall (the ones from 2008) but the updated Canada
 Food Guide includes the "Choose Most" foods.
- Hot lunch program at South Nelson was put on hold this week because of the menu options. Advisor is working with the Principal at South Nelson this week.
- For BC Agriculture in the Classroom it is a requirement that everyone has FoodSafe, but this will primarily be applicable for the district staff.

 - Healthy balance \$13,000, great time to start looking at funding \$11,585.03 general; \$2108.53 gaming, there is some money owing
 - Applied for gaming grant
 - Wants to hear ideas to develop the budget for the next meeting.
